Yardage Requirements for "D" and "DD" Ladies: Because the special bodice front piece is a bit longer, you'll need to add 1/8 yd. to the yardage requirements for sizes 18-26 given above (for either 45" or 54"-wide material).

Fabric suggestions: Pima cotton, organdy, voile, linen, silk, 100% cotton, lightweight shirting. Lining can be 100% cotton muslin or pima.

Notions: Thread, 12-18 3/8" buttons (see pattern instructions), one hook and eye for waistband (optional). For the nursing bodice, you will need 4-5 5/8" buttons to close the front flap, plus four snaps.

Notes: * 5/8" seam allowed except where noted in instructions.

* This pattern was designed to fit over the corseted bustline of the period. If you do not plan to wear a corset, I recommend cutting the bodice out two sizes larger than your measurements indicate to give proper ease.

* To save on printing costs, I had to overlap the skirt front and back pieces. The overlapping lines alternate between dots and dashes to help you distinguish between the sizes. The cuffed sleeves were "nested" for the same reason.

* The skirt pieces were made long to accommodate taller ladies, but you can shorten them to whatever length you wish. If you plan to add tucks to the skirt, remember to add to your yardage amount according to the number of tucks, plus their width (e.g. four half-inch tucks = four inches of fabric times two (front and back of skirt), so eight inches total).
