Notions:		Thread, eight to twelve 3/8" buttons.						
Notes:	*	With 60" wide fabric, you can cut skirt front and back for sizes 1-4 from a single width of fabric by folding each selvedge to the center, giving you 30" of material on either side, each with a fold for the center front/back.
